## **A-level Geography London Trip 2025**

The A-level Geography field trip to London for this academic year will take place on Tuesday 3 June.

To enhance the learning of the geography specification, the department will be organising a fieldwork day to London covering the main Human Geography themes of urban regeneration and a changing sense of place. We will be visiting several different parts of the city, including Canary Wharf, the London Docklands Museum and Brick Lane. We require students to meet at school at 8am for us to walk into East Grinstead to conduct some fieldwork and then we will get the train from East Grinstead train station at 9:36am. We aim to return there by around 6-6:30pm that evening. Students should then be collected or make their way home from the station.

I will be returning to East Grinstead and students are welcome to travel with me. If students would like to stay in London after the trip, I will dismiss them from London Victoria. Please specify in your email to me whether your child will travel back with the group, or independently.

The field trip will be run by myself and while participation in the course is technically optional, it is strongly recommended as it is an opportunity to bring the class-taught Geography to life and is tailored specifically to helping students succeed in their exams. We will of course cover the necessary material during lessons as well. There is no upfront fee for this trip, but students will be expected to book their train tickets on the day at the station in small groups. This allows us to take advantage of the group bookings' discounts, which means that the cost of the train ticket including use of London transport is reduced to around £19.50 per person.

Students should also bring a packed lunch/snacks for the day and/or some money to cover the cost of lunch. Some additional funds for incidental costs are also recommended, while all students should bring their full water bottle. If you find it difficult to meet this cost, you are invited to contact me in confidence to discuss this. Insurance for all school trips is arranged through West Sussex County Council. Full details of the policy can be found on our website. Peanuts or peanut related products are not allowed to be taken on any school visit.
