### AS Geography Field Course 2016 – an update

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Students need to assemble at school on **Friday 18<sup>th</sup> March at 7.30am**. They should bring a packed lunch for the day and be dressed for fieldwork. The group will travel in two minibuses to Pembrokeshire, stopping en-route to carry out fieldwork. We aim to return back to school by 5.00pm on Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> March and we will instruct students to update you during the journey.

It is essential that students come properly prepared for fieldwork, which is likely to take place in adverse weather conditions. I have therefore **attached a kit list**. I have also attached a **parental consent form which I ask you to complete and return with the final balance by 26<sup>th</sup> February 2016**.

The fieldwork programme will include, on the **physical** side, a river study, a sand dune study and a coastal study. On the **human** side, it will include a visit to the Centre for Alternative Technology and two urban studies. However, all fieldwork will also have a **focus on fieldwork skills and techniques** which is essential for the delivery of unit 2 of the AS syllabus 'Geographical Skills'.

I would emphasise that this represents a full programme of study and students will be expected to work and stay focused whilst carrying out fieldwork in the day *and* during classroom sessions in the evening.

**Recommended AS Fieldwork Kit List**  
(please ask students to check with members of staff if there are any concerns or questions):

**Waterproof coat**

**Waterproof trousers**

**Warm trousers** – not jeans as these absorb water and become heavy and difficult to dry in wet conditions

**Warm coat or fleece**

**Warm base layer**

**Walking boots** – these should have plenty of tread on the sole and should be fairly waterproof

**Walking socks** – at least two pairs

**Old trainers/sandals** - for wading in rivers (wellington boots can be taken but are often overtopped and are uncomfortable if worn for long periods of time)

**Gloves and hat**

**Sun hat, sun glasses and sun cream**

**A small day rucksack (25 litres)**

**Fieldwork notebook**

**Clipboard**

**Folder to keep work in**

**Stationery and calculator**

**Laptop**

**Camera/phone** – plus leads to connect to a computer/charger

**Watch**

**MP3 player or similar** - for the journeys
