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Dear Parent/Carer

CNAT, GCSE, A Level and CTECH Physical Education Videoing Practical Evidence

Due to the restrictions caused by COVID-19 at present we are unfortunately unable to hold our usual consultation evening on Practical Coursework in Physical Education for our examination students. Practical evidence will still be required, if only on a limited basis, for those students studying for their CNAT, GCSE, A level's and CTECH's for external moderation in the summer term. This may change as it is dependent on the virus and how it is affecting the participation of everyone in sport across the whole of the country.

Practical – CNAT, GCSE, A Level and CTECH

The students have to show their skills in a fully competitive game or race. At the start of all film footage the student must present themselves to the camera in their full sports kit. This is to identify that the candidate has all their correct equipment and highlight any distinguishable features or items of clothing. The student will also need to state their name and candidate number to the camera and if they are wearing a kit with a number/name on the back of their shirt they will have to turn around to show/highlight this number or name.

All footage has to be filmed continuously from the start of the game and cannot be stopped unless it is for half time or a bad injury. The evidence required can be just for half a game or a number of halves of various matches. During the footage the students must show all the core and advanced skills to enable them to be graded.

Games activities should all be filmed from the halfway line, unless playing as Goalkeeper in Football. Individual activities taking place in the pool or on the race track can be filmed from the side of the pool or track. If filming cross country, distance run, cross country horse riding or cycling then these activities will need multiple cameras to film from different places or a drone filming from above.

After completing the filming it must be noted the higher the level/standard of race/competition that the student participates in, the greater the mark that can be achieved. Therefore, it is very important that the most appropriate evidence is chosen to gain the highest possible mark.

It is very important to get this footage filmed as soon as possible due to the fact that sports may slowly reduce due to the COVID-19 situation. If you wish to borrow a camera speak to us as soon as possible as we have some available to use.













If your child is in year 9 then it may be useful to film them in their activities. However, as they have two more years studying the subject we are sure that their performance level will be higher in the forthcoming two years (year 10 and 11).
