Safeguarding - On-line

Safe Online Shopping



More and more of us are shopping online, even more so this time of year. Many individuals use online websites for convenience and ease however, there are risks associated with online shopping and you need to take care with what you are buying, from whom, and how you pay for your purchases.

Safe shopping

- Ensure that any online retailer unfamiliar to you is reputable by researching them.
- Remember that paying by credit card offers greater protection than with other methods in terms of fraud, guarantees and non-delivery.
- Do not reply to unsolicited emails from companies you don't recognise.
- Before entering payment card details on a website, ensure that the link is secure, in two ways:
 - There should be a padlock symbol in the browser window frame, which appears when you attempt to log in or register. Be sure that the padlock is not on the page itself ... this will probably indicate a fraudulent site.
 - \circ The web address should begin with 'https://'. The 's' stands for 'secure'.
- Do not pay for goods when using an unsecured Wi-Fi connection.
- When making a payment to a company or individual, never transfer the money directly into their bank account but use a secure payment site such as PayPal, where money is transferred between two electronic accounts.
- Check sellers' privacy policy and returns policy.
- Always log out of sites into which you have logged in or registered details. Simply closing your browser is not enough to ensure privacy.


