

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### **Children's Safeguarding - Position of Trust**

Are you looking to enrol your child in any summer camps or clubs?

Does your child already participate in an activity that brings them into contact with people over the age of 16 who are in a Position of Trust?

The Local Authority Designated Officers (LADOs) for West Sussex are wanting to raise awareness amongst the general public about what to do when you are concerned about an individual in a Position of Trust.

We know some organisations could be more robust with safe recruitment or safeguarding processes, so we would encourage parents, when accessing services or clubs for children, to ask the organisation some basic safeguarding questions to ensure they are safe.

### **NEW parental controls on Instagram**



Instagram has launched new parental controls on the platform in the UK, allowing parents to set a daily time limit and schedule break times.

Meta, which owns the app, said parents and guardians of users aged under 18 can now set a daily time limit between 15 minutes to 2 hours before a black screen appears.

The new supervision features will also allow parents to see accounts reported by their children and the reason, as well as see who follows them and who they follow, and schedule breaks.

Parents can now initiate the supervision tools by sending an invitation to their child, which previously only the children could send.
