June is Pride month and I wanted to take this opportunity to acknowledge it. Having grown up near Brighton, I have always felt that Pride events were held in August, and I wasn't aware why the month of June was chosen nationally and worldwide. Having done a small amount of Googling I can reliably inform you that June was chosen as this is when the Stonewall Riots took place (1969).



For some members of the LGBT+ community there is still a need to keep this element of their identity secret or suppressed, which can lead to a negative impact on

their wellbeing. In addition, research shows that those who are LBGT+ are still marginalised, further adding to potential struggles with wellbeing.
