A school art department is a world of its own.



Wellbeing Weekly

Hannah Nibloe writes:

Did you know that this week (13th - 19th June) is <u>Men's Health Week</u>? Research shows that men do not see their GP or seek medical advice as much as women do. This can lead to early diagnosis of minor or major health conditions being missed.

This week, men are being encouraged to get their yearly MOT (a gender stereotype playing out here, if it gets men to their GP though....!). On top of physical health check, this week's campaign is encouraging men to open up about their emotional wellbeing and mental health. Sadly, the statistics around male suicide make uncomfortable reading; Men aged 45-64 have the highest rate of suicide by age (20 per 100,000). Suicide is the second biggest cause of death in young males (1-19 years old).

With it being Father's Day this weekend perhaps we could find time to check in with the men in our lives and signpost them where needed.
