Safeguarding Weekly

Scam Alerts



Online scams continue to rise with cyber criminals taking advantage of our current economic situation.

Millions more people have been targeted by scammers as the cost-of-living crisis takes hold, new research by Citizens Advice has found. More than three quarters of UK adults said they have been targeted by a scammer this year - a 14% increase compared to this time last year.

The most common types of scams reported included:

- Deliveries, postal or courier services (55%)
- Someone pretending to be from the government or HMRC (41%)
- Someone offering a fake investment 'get rich quick' schemes (29%)
- Rebates and refunds (28%)
- Banking (27%)
- Online shopping (24%)
- Health or medical (13%)
- Energy scams (12%)

It could be a scam if:

- It seems too good to be true
- You suspect you're not dealing with a real company, organisation or a genuine person take a moment to step back and double-check
- You've been pressured to transfer money quickly
- You've been asked to pay in an unusual way
- You've been asked to give away personal information such as passwords, PINs or other verification codes.

If you've been scammed:

- Talk to your bank or card company immediately if you've handed over any financial and sensitive information or made a payment
- Report the scam to Citizens Advice. Offline scams, like telephone, post and doorstep, to the Citizens Advice website or by calling 0808 223 1133. Report online scams to the dedicated Scams Action service either online or on 0808 250 5050
- Text scams can be reported to your mobile phone provider by forwarding it to 7726
- Also report the scam to Action Fraud.
