Message from the PE Department for Year 7 Parents

- Extra curricular sessions begin on Monday 15 September, attendance at these really benefits students develop their skills, game play and meeting new friends.
- Additional equipment for this year - National Governing Bodies of rugby and hockey strongly recommend that students wear a gum shield and in the case of hockey shin pads. Football boots are not essential but if students wish to join extra curricular activities and represent the school then football boots would be necessary.
- Inter Community Event - Thursday 25 September - The first Inter Community Event will take place after school on the date shown. Students can come along and represent their community in either football or netball.
- There has been a recent increase in the wearing of jewelry and the chewing of gum, both of these can cause serious injury so please remind your children of the dangers during physical activity.

Additional PE Information for All Parents and Families

- Students who frequently forget PE kit will be given two reminders before being issued with a detention. The kit expectations can be found [here](#). Please note all kit, other than socks should be navy and not black.
- Please ensure if your child is not able to take part in PE lessons that you contact their PE teacher as soon as possible. The best form of communication would be via email but a hand written note is also acceptable which needs to be handed to their PE teacher at the start of the lesson.
- A secondary pair of trainers is strongly recommended for PE lessons. The footwear/trainers that students wear as part of their school uniform are often not safe or suitable for PE lessons. Please encourage your child to bring this additional pair of trainers on the days they have PE.
- We use an online system for organizing and communicating our school fixtures, this is called SOCS and can be accessed by clicking [here](#). PE staff will email those students and parents that are involved directly. To access additional information on the website the password is - RH19Sports.
- Aerosol deodorants are not permitted in the changing rooms, they are harmful for students both with and without asthma. If deodorant needs to be applied please advise your children to bring a roll-on deodorant. Any student who requires an inhaler should ensure that they pass this to their teacher at the beginning of the lesson.


Sackville School is excited to announce the musical for February 2026 will be Bring It On.

A.I for Multi-Lingual Families

Using A.I to Enhance Accessibility and Communication For Multi-Lingual Families

- Use to translate normative communication, for example everyday letters and correspondence, such as notification of non-school uniform days or nits in the class!
- Use to adjust simple extended text formats, such as letters or generic support guides. Language can be chunked, dual-coded (visuals added), and transformed to accommodate literacy levels of the audience. Then translated too!
- Can offer live translation (including text to speech, speech to text, and combined) options that could support informal conversations such as at drop off, pick up or reception support. This can be an effective way to **start** conversations.

Culturally competent relational practice which prioritises psychological and physical safety, and accessibility, should be felt and experienced by all community members. Please ask your Advisory Teacher for further support or information.

- Not to be used in sensitive, confidential or complex scenarios (for example safeguarding). Relational practice is paramount and for the wellbeing of all involved such topic/agendas should be navigated carefully.
- Jargon is rarely translated effectively or with integrity of meaning. Where such language cannot be avoided, or where loaded terminology will be used, human interpreters should be utilised.
- Language proficiency varies significantly from language to language. Gaps in efficiency and accuracy will greatly undermine the understanding of all involved. Coproduction can only be achieved with all fully informed and acting with agency.
- A.I cannot replicate the human nature and experience of education and relationships. It cannot authentically develop interpersonal skills that interpreters/advocates can.
