• **Sports Surfaces Application** - Further to the open meeting sharing the potential plans for our new improved sports surfaces, I am pleased to advise that the planning application has been submitted. This is very exciting and the school could benefit hugely from the facilities we would be able to provide our students.

We have the support of the East Grinstead Town Sports Council and local sports clubs, as we want to be sure this facility could also be enjoyed by other clubs in our community.

Support from all, both school users and community clubs and associations is really important for the planning application. So, please may I ask that you take a few minutes to follow the link below and leave a positive comment. If there are any clubs/groups in the area who may be interested in using the facilities, please leave a comment also.

The hockey turf pitch (HTP) is designed to support a high level of play with a modern sand dressed artificial turf. It will not support international level but we understood that this was not needed – avoiding significant costs for water irrigation and increased lighting.

As for the artificial grass pitch (AGP), this is similarly designed to support a high level of play for football, but it also meets requirements for rugby. However, due to the site constraints here, it could only support rugby training rather than competitive games.

Both of the pitches can support wider sports at recreational level (i.e. athletics on the HTP).

# **Spotlight on Online Safety**

### Misinformation online

This week we have been looking at the rise of online misinformation and ways we can check for content validity.

#### What is misinformation?

Misinformation on Social Media – Guidance, Impact and Support Fake news, or misinformation can be created and shared across social media particularly during significant events that have a big impact on our society. For example, we saw a flurry of fake news relating to Covid-19 during and in the wake of the pandemic.

Recently, the BBC reflected on this type of fake news in their 'Should bad science be censored on social media?' article. Although this article shapes a much larger conversation around censorship, it did convey the type of information that was being shared, and the impact that this misleading information had, mentioning that 'People were dissuaded from taking vaccines as a result of reading misleading information online'.



#### What is Fake News?

With so many sources of information online, some children might struggle to make sense of what is true. In the guide from Internet Matters, you and your child can learn about misinformation, what it looks like and how it impacts children's wellbeing and safety online. <u>Click here</u> for their YouTube video guide.

In class students have been looking at the 5 C's methods of checking sources of information. Please discuss these at home and how they can use these prompts to validate information and check its validity

- 1. Context Looking at the context of the article
- 2. Credibility who wrote it? Where does it come from?
- 3. Construction What is the bias? Are there any loaded phrases? Is it fact or opinion?
- 4. Corroboration Make sure other credible sources say the same
- 5. Compare Compare it to other sources to gain a perspective
