Students will be able to: Describe the impact of World War One. Explain how it changed living standards and politics in Germany.	Germany knowledge assessment: Comparing Hitler's actions to the context of Weimar Germany
Spr 1	Hitler's Rise to Power, 1929-1934 and Life in Nazi Germany, 1934-1939	Understanding how Hitler was able to manipulate the weaknesses of a failing government is important as it created a huge shift for Germans with the end of democracy. Students can analyse to what extent the change to life in Germany was managed by fear and control. They are also able to debate the extent of opposition.	So students can see how a clear chronology of events led to political change in Germany. Students need to understand why life would change for many Germans before they learn how. Students learn this last as this is the product of political change and Hitler's rise to power in Germany.	Students will be able to: Describe how Hitler came to power. Explain how Hitler went from Chancellor to Dictator. Describe life for different groups of people living in explain. Explain the extent of opposition to Hitler and how it was controlled.
