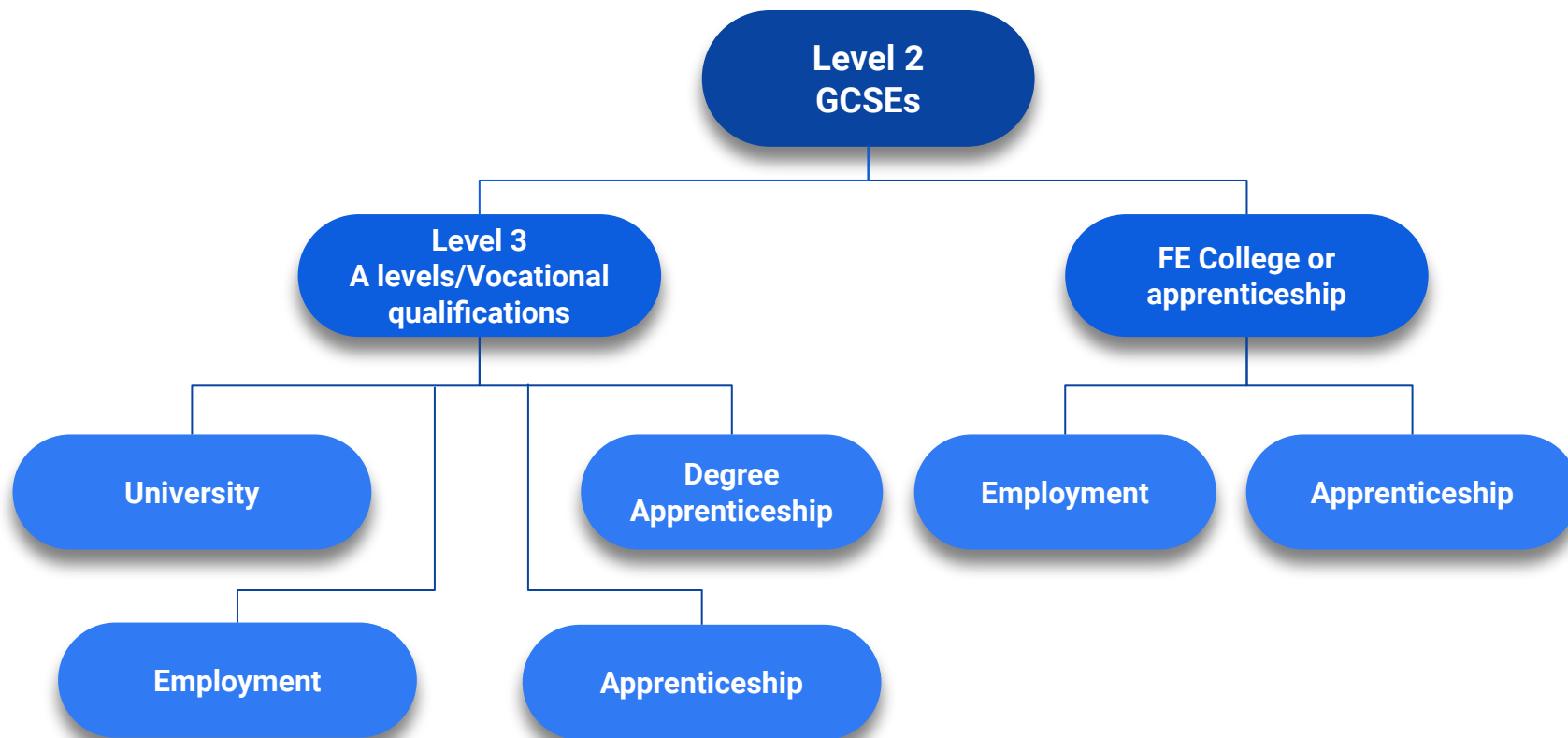

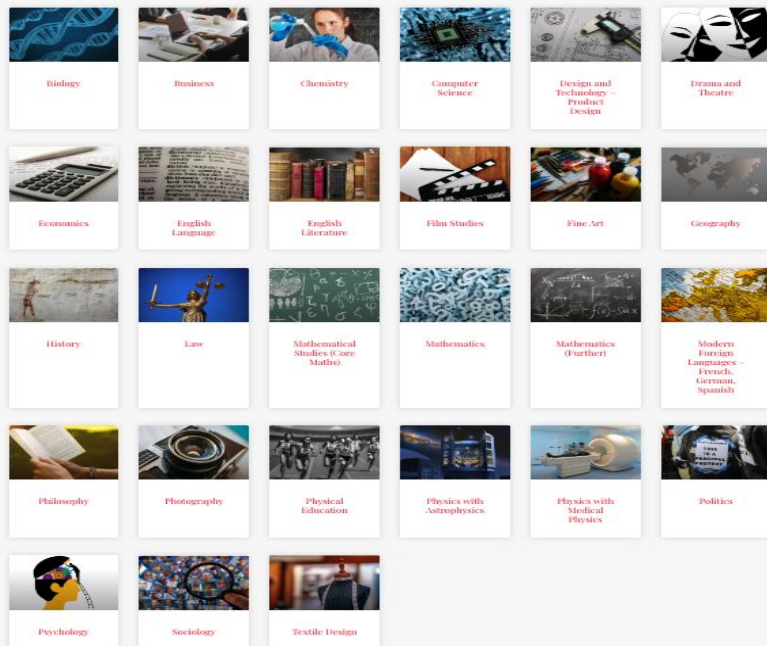

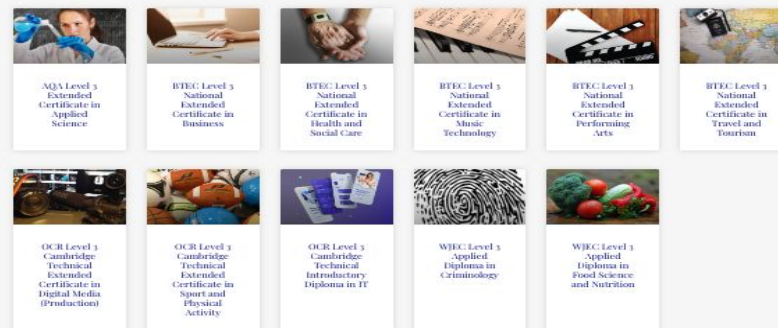


A Level Course Directory

EPQ - Extended Project Qualification

- A standalone qualification taken in addition to three level 3 subjects
- Worth half an A-level (28 UCAS points)
- Some universities make lower A-level offers to students undertaking an EPQ

Core Maths

- Worth half an A-level (28 UCAS points)
- Viewed favourably by universities and employers
- This is taken in addition to three level 3 subjects

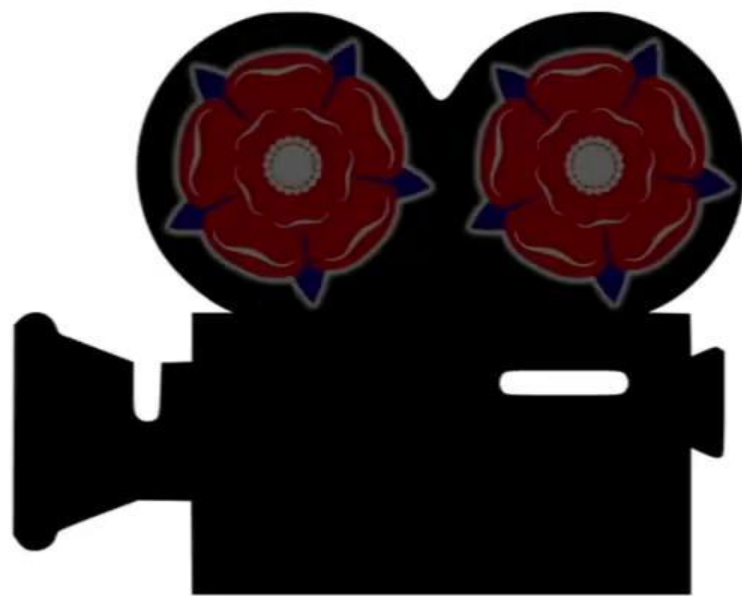
