Year 10 Geography Trip to Wales

Written by Chloe G: On the 8 July, year 10 geography students woke up bright and early, with suitcases, duffel bags and rucksacks in hand ready for a three-day trip to Wales, for our river study fieldwork enquiry. After a long journey we finally made it to the first destination, the Sgwd Clun-Gwyn Waterfalls Walk, a lovely reward, especially after an uneasy climb down to it. If that's not enough, we continued along the river until we reached Porth yr Ogof, a cave, where we received our first of many geography talks. It was a long day, so was relieving when we arrived at Swansea University, eager to check into our rooms and try some interesting but not half bad dinner.



Having breakfast at eight the next morning, we were soon on the road to destination two, the Brecon Beacons. Enduring quite a vertical climb up to the top, we safely made our way back down the other side to the source of the River Taff, where we received a talk by Mr Johnson and demonstration on how to measure the river's depth, width, and velocity, linking this to Bradshaw's Model. However, the high spirits didn't last too long as the rain fell and kept falling for pretty much the entirety of our walk further down the upper course. I am sure a highlight for many was the burger van at the end. As the weather didn't get much better, we abandoned our attempts in Aberfan, however we did get to the mouth of the river in Cardiff.

I think a highlight for everyone was the two evenings that we spent on the beach, with the rain cleared, as we watched some lovely sunsets whilst keeping ourselves busy with ball games and even frisbee for some.

On our way back, others and I went to the Big Pit Coal Museum in Blaenavon. After queueing a very long time we went down around 350ft and experienced a fun, informative tour about what life was like for coal miners. Definitely worth the wait. Overall, this trip was great fun, despite the classic Welsh weather! **Chloe**

We then measured the other parts of the river the weather did fluctuate but we were resilient and managed to get the readings. We got back to the campus and went to a different beach called Caswell Bay. After that we got back to campus and went to sleep ready to go home.

The last part of our journey involved the big pit, a mine, this was very interesting especially as my Great Grandpa was a miner. After we had finished, we got on the coach to get home and that unfortunately put an end to a very enjoyable trip. **Lewis**

U13's Cricket Tournament, Burgess Hill




