Unfortunately, the thin cloud and moonlight prevented a view of "the green comet" - maybe you'll have better luck! See you in March!









The evening started with a welcome talk from Mrs Valentine, Head of Sixth form followed by a presentation from Sussex University on How to choose a University and course, and finally a presentation by James Brooklyn from ASK on apprenticeships. Students and parents then had the opportunity to talk to visit the exhibitors' stands and were able to ask representatives questions regarding the courses offered at each establishment. This was a wonderful opportunity for our young people to start to think about their future pathways and an ideal opportunity to investigate the routes that are open to them.

## Sackville Sixth Form – A Message from Mrs Helen Valentine

The spring term for sixth formers is a particularly crucial one. Students in year 12 have settled into their chosen subjects and are fully aware of the demands of sixth form study both in lessons and in independent study. We have been delighted to introduce **supervised study periods for year 12 students.** We thank students and parents for embracing this so positively. I would also like to thank Mrs Bull for her sterling work in managing this new system.

Mrs Bull has now been in situ as our **KS5 attendance and sixth form intervention officer** for half a term and I know students across the year groups are finding her support invaluable.

Our term started with Mr de Souza leading **study skills sessions** for both year 12 and year 13 students in our weekly SMSC sessions. Sixth form tutors then followed this up with form tutor sessions. Our **SMSC programme** goes from strength to strength covering a wide range of issues - this week we welcomed the **NHS education team** to talk with our year 12 students. Staff members have given great assemblies - Mr Bush inspired our students with an assembly on the **quality of resilience** - one of our key Sackville values. Mr Batsford delivered a key assembly on **addiction** and how to seek help.

Following on from our very successful **Higher Education Fair**, year 12s are now busy researching future plans and career pathways, whether that be through an apprenticeship, employment or degree route. For year 13, university offers are coming through thick and fast now - we have offers for our **106 university candidates** from a wide range of universities for a wide range of subjects. Candidates have offers from **Oxford, Bristol, Durham, Exeter, Nottingham, Kings, Cardiff, Swansea, Leeds, Lincoln, Portsmouth and <b>Oxford Brookes** to name but a few. We wish our year 13 students well as they prepare for their second set of mocks next half term and then their final exams.

We are delighted that so many of our KS5 students are involved with Grease, the school show. Whilst it is clear who has acting roles, it is not always so clear that many of our gifted students are giving time to set design, props, costume help, musical accompaniments and lighting and sound. Thank you to those students.

We have a few **notable achievements for students** - it is impossible to name them all but here are a few examples of the achievements of our talented young people. We send our warmest congratulations to them and to the many others who have not always been forthcoming in telling us of their achievements. Recently Theo has taken part in the prestigious national Chemistry Olympiad, Sarah has been part of a gold medal Four Nations winning team for taekwondo, Rachel and Lillie continue with their swimming competitions at a high level, Jamie continues to train with the national youth squad for sailing and Jess has qualified as a ski instructor.

Ten of our year 12/13 students are undertaking a **British Sign Language course** at school - this is a nationally recognised qualification that not only enhances their portfolio of skills but also demonstrates our students' desire and commitment to help others.

We are pleased that so many of our year 11 students are excited about **joining Sackville Sixth Form in September** 2023. We will shortly be releasing details about **taster days and familiarisation events.**
