I am delighted to begin 2020 by sharing wonderful news of sixth form successes!

Firstly, I would like to congratulate **Grace de Souza** who has achieved a confirmed place at **Oxford University** (Worcester College) to read geography. Grace was our head girl and completed her studies last year. Amongst much else, she performed major roles in our school shows. We are all delighted for her.

Alongside Grace, we have **three students** in year 13 who have secured conditional places at **Oxford and Cambridge**. We are confident they will get the grades they need to secure these offers.

A further **35** students have received at least one offer from a Russell Group university which is fantastic! The universities include **Durham**, **Imperial**, **LSE**, **UCL**, **King's**, **Warwick**, **Edinburgh**, **York**, **Exeter**, **Leeds** and **Nottingham**. I would like to wish all the sixth form students every success in their journeys as they complete their mock examinations and begin to prepare for the summer.

As many parents will know, we introduced our students to the **EPQ (Extended Project Qualification)** last year, which is a good enhancement to A level studies and well received by universities. I am very pleased to share that our first set of results have been extremely encouraging. The nine students who entered achieved 3 A* grades, 1 A grade, 3 B grades and 2 C grades. Many congratulations to them!

As if our sixth formers were not busy enough, eleven of our year 12 and 13 students embarked upon a **week of work experience** on Monday January 13th in the fascinating German city of **Hamburg**. Placements ranged from **businesses to kindergartens and hospitals** and I was fortunate enough to accompany them for the first part of the week. Working with our partner school in the suburb of Harburg, all of the placements were set up carefully to give each individual student a **bespoke**, **relevant experience**. In past years, it has often shaped their **university choices**. I was so impressed by their mature approach to this and also very grateful to those organisations in Hamburg who were so helpful.









On the Sunday before the work began, the students took the train to **Berlin** to enjoy a day's sightseeing. Highlights included climbing to the top of the **Siegessaule** (Victory Column – 285 steps), the **Brandenburg Gate** and the **Reichstag**. We were certainly well-exercised that day!

I would like to thank **Mrs Valentine**, **Mrs Plumb**, **Mrs Barden** and **Mr Watson** for all their hard work in making this such a success.



Younger students in the school have also been busy achieving great things. Many congratulations go to **Tilly Vickery** in year 10, who beat very stiff competition at local level at Oxted School to reach the next round of the **Rotary Young Chef Competition** at Merton College on Saturday 29th February.

Tilly worked calmly and effectively throughout, producing some very exciting dishes including caramelised onion and goats cheese tart, stuffed chicken, fondant potatoes and roasted tomatoes, and creme brûlée with redcurrants.

I would like to thank **Mrs Smeaton** for giving up her Saturday to support this and to offer my best wishes to Tilly for the next round.

Well done also to **Bea Chappell** and **Emma Smyth** who represented East Grinstead in the **U16 National Indoor Girls' Hockey Final** on Sunday 19th January. Unfortunately East Grinstead did not win, but the experience was one the girls will not forget easily nonetheless.
