Dear Parents and Carers,

We are now only a few days away from **welcoming back our year 10 and 12 students** for some face-to-face lessons and we are looking forward to this greatly. All of our year 10 families have been called by **Mr Millican** or **Mrs Sands** and we know the students too are keen to come back in.

Live lessons

With the increasing number of **live lessons**, we thought it would be useful for parents to know how students will be notified of them.

When the lesson is set up, the students receive an email informing them and asking whether they are going to attend.



It doesn't matter whether the students accept the invitation or not - they can still come to the lesson. The joining buttons are highlighted in the screenshot.



Students can see the all of the live lessons on their **calendars**, which can be accessed <u>here</u>. The calendar can also be accessed from the **timetable link** on the Google Chrome landing page (highlighted above)



The calendar will have the student's normal timetable in highlighted blocks. The **live lessons** are in blue in this screenshot, and not filled in as they have not yet been accepted. If they are accepted, they will fill with a colour.

Use of the calendar each day will allow the students to see all of the lessons which are coming up.

With the livelessons shown in this way, it leaves **Show My Homework** for the communication of work set to support the lessons taught.

We would be grateful if parents and carers share this with their children, as they have had no tuition in school about how this operates!
