Dear Parents and Carers

It has been lovely to take some steps back to normality this half term. Students are no longer zoned but are enjoying **lessons in specialist rooms**. Practicals are back for all and have started for year 7s – very successfully judging by these cookies!

Sports fixtures have started, and the gentle sound of leather on willow can be heard in the summer sun. Our **sports coverage** resumes later in the newsletter.

Despite these new freedoms, **Monday's announcements** remind us that we are still living with COVID, and the **delay of a month** to the full release from lockdown has dictated some changes to our final half term.



- Our **proms** are being rearranged. The **year 11 prom** will take place at Reigate Manor on Wednesday 21st July, but some activities will have to be curtailed because of the danger of aerosol transmission. We plan to move our **final leavers' assembly** to the venue as well. Attendance at the event will require proof of a negative lateral flow test on the day.
- ☐ The **year 13 prom** will not now go ahead. Instead, we will mark the departure of this wonderful year group by serving them a **high tea at an outdoor event** in school on Wednesday 21st July. Some other fun activities will also take place but plans are at an early stage at present.
- ☐ The Jamie Young Teenage Cancer Trust fundraiser will have to be postponed again.
- ☐ The congested nature of the final week has meant the difficult decision to bring **sports days** forward by a week, to the week beginning 12th July. Unfortunately, this year it means **parents will not be able to attend**.



Last month, I wrote about a slight change to the **timings of the day for the new academic year**. We have now finalised these following discussions with Estcots School. To **allow the smooth exit of students from both schools** we have arranged for our day to end at 14.35.


Our exams office has been busy this week inputting and verifying the **school** assessed grades for our exam years. The exam boards will now quality-assure these results, and officially issue them on August 10^{th} and 12^{th} .

There will be an **appeals process** for any students who feel they have been issued an unfair grade, though it will be a little different this year. In the event of an appeal, the school will double check that its own procedures have been followed and that the correct grade was submitted to the exam board. Following this, the appeal will be referred to the examining board itself.

Officials from the board will look at the evidence used to generate the school assessed grade and **decide whether the result issued is reasonable based on the evidence**. A form will be available on the school website during results week with further details of the process. It is important to note that this year it is possible that **grades could go down as well as up on appeal**, since there are no overall marks or grade boundaries to guide us.

Whilst our year 11s are awaiting their exam results, why not get involved in some of the excellent **transition activities** available on our Google classrooms? These classrooms are designed to prepare students for sixth form study. This document with the class codes was sent to all year 11 students this week, and also includes details of



some in-school sessions. Some of these need signing up for, and all require proof of a negative lateral flow test within 24 hours of the session.

The document also has details of the **virtual induction session to the sixth form**.

Next week is another busy one at school. Even though it is an INSET day, year 12 progression exams start on Monday.

Wednesday to Friday see the **selection process for a new headteacher to commence in January 2022**. These will be strange days for me, as I am

not involved in the selection of my successor. I completely trust the judgement of our outstanding governing body, and I wish the best of luck to all four candidates. I hope that whoever is successful enjoys working with the wonderful Sackville community as much as I have, and I look forward to liaising effectively with the new head during the autumn term to ensure a smooth handover.



Our students continue to do amazing things. You will recall that **Amber Titchener** in year 12 has been selected as a Yamaha Ambassador (their youngest in fact).

She's creating quite a buzz in the music press, and beyond that is featured in the latest issue *Her* magazine, and we hope to be able to get copyright permission to
