Dear Parents and Carers,

Without doubt the highlight of this week has been the **return of our year 10 students**. After 87 days, this was a giant step forwards. Of course we don't know how things will run in the autumn, but we do know that our year 10s are not only ready to return to school, but are eager to learn. The students came in with a **magnificent attitude** this week, and the teachers were full of praise for the efforts they showed in their four lessons of maths, English, science and either history or geography.



**Real students are in real classrooms** and we fervently hope this is the beginning of the return to normality. At present, we are welcoming the maximum number of students for the maximum number of teaching sessions possible under current government restrictions, with both years 10 and 12 to provide for on our site. We are really looking forward to being able to increase this once

permitted. **Safety** will always remain of paramount importance. We also have some fifty students (children of key workers) in school every day and they are receiving specialist teaching provision.

Students were naturally cautious about a return to school, and I want to acknowledge the **vital work done by you, the parents and carers, in preparing them for this**.

Next week it is the turn of **year 12 students**, who will have a 90-minute session with each of their subjects in preparation for their **progression exams** the week after.

Sackville has gone above and beyond and it really shows!!

Remote learning continues apace and I am delighted with the **growing number of live lessons being offered**. Even if contact is virtual, students seem to value seeing and hearing their teachers and peers online. We are holding another **virtual parental focus group at 4pm on Monday**, and we would love to hear your views about the in-school and out-of-school provision. Students are also working very hard on the tasks set via Show My Homework. **Miss Bishop's year 8 geography students** have been making **weather monitoring equipment**. That rain gauge will have been perfect for this week's storms. Students have also made barometers, temperature stations, weather vanes and cloud cover measurers.



Spare a thought tomorrow for **Jamie Young in year 10**: he and a few socially distancing friends and family are cycling from the Royal Marsden Hospital in Sutton to the Alex's Children's Hospital in Brighton, a **distance of over 70km**.

They are raising money for the **Teenage Cancer Trust** to mark the anniversary of Jamie's successful treatment for cancer.

Jamie has set up a [fundraising page](#) and although he has smashed his initial target, wants to raise every penny he can for this excellent charity which over the years has supported a number of Sackville students in very difficult circumstances.
