Dear Parents/Carers



As we approach half-term, it is pleasing to be able to look back on a few weeks which seem **much more normal** than what we have experienced since early in 2020.

A highlight for me personally has been to see so many parents and students come in for our **year 11 and year 9 GCSE information evenings**. Year 9 parents were introduced to how we support their students through the next three years, whilst for year 11 it was focussed practical advice about the final exam year.

The return of **assemblies** is also extremely welcome. This term has seen presentations on **school standards**, the **environment** and **Black History Month**.

Assemblies are part of our wider Learning for Life (L4L) programme, much of which is delivered by tutors. We are now setting aside two de-timetabled lessons each half term for whole-school L4L. The first of these was on Tuesday. The sixth form had sessions on safe driving and personal finance (pictured). Key stage 4 students participated superbly in sessions exploring relationships and consent, and for key stage 3 students the focus was growing up and puberty.





It was especially pleasing to see how well the **new year 7s** engaged with these sessions. This group of young people are rapidly creating a very positive impression in the school. On Friday last week over 200 of them stayed late on Friday to enjoy an **activities evening**. Students had the chance to take part in a number of activities, including

benchball, dodgeball, basketball, orienteering, an inflatable session and Head of Year 7 Mr Endersby's own patent game 'buses'. The noise could be heard on the other side of town!

In between the students were treated to an **evening snack** by our canteen staff and Mrs Mustard and I were delighted to be able to support them serving the students.

Thanks to Mr Endersby for his tremendous hard work, to the other staff who supported the event, and of course to the students who entered into the spirit of the evening with such verve.

With the return of fixtures, we have been able to play the **three autumn memorial games against Imberhorne**. Honours were even between us in



the rugby last week with the **U14 Chris Cooney Cup** won by Imberhorne, and Sackville returning with the **U16 Barry Newman** silverware. Both matches were played in an impeccable spirit, which would have pleased Chris Cooney, a tremendously keen Sackville player who sadly passed away in year 13.



On Wednesday night the school first 11s played for the Adam Dabell Memorial Trophy. As usual the game was keenly fought with a year's bragging rights at stake. This year Sackville ran out deserved winners, with five outstanding goals, two from captain Ben Aubrey, two from Harvey Burgess and one from Matei Cumpatescu. The cup was presented by local MP Mims Davies.

Dark evenings do not just mean floodlit football games though; our **observatory open evenings** are back! Mr Bush writes about this later in the newsletter.



STEM (science, technology, engineering and maths) remain a real strength of the school, and this year we are delighted to have secured a record **three Arkwright scholars**. Congratulations to **Sienna Mogg, Max Goddard** and **Freya Ohta**, the latest in a long Sackville tradition.

Competition is always fierce for these awards, and the students not only had to demonstrate their engineering credentials, but also life skills such as leadership and creative thinking. Fewer than

three hundred scholarships have been awarded so far this year, which shows just how well our team have done.

The students can look forward to a two year working relationship with their **partner companies** and a strong headstart to a career in engineering.

The next generation of young engineers is hard at work in our year 8 technology lessons learning to use the online **computer aided design** tool *OnShape* to create designs that can then be created by our computer-aided manufacturing machines.



School trips are gradually returning. Our year 11 geography students visited the East End of London on Tuesday 5th October. This trip supports the part of the curriculum they are now studying. Students looked at the impact of the **Olympic developments** on the area, considering the pros and cons of the major building work that has occurred.



Thank-you to the geography teachers for making the subject even more alive than usual!

Mrs Valentine and Mrs Bush accompanied four year 13 students to **Oxford University** to meet admission tutor Ken Amor and discuss ways we can support more Sackville students to succeed with Oxbridge applications.

This was the first in-person meeting Mr Amor had had with prospective candidates since before the pandemic, and the information we gained will be very useful this year and beyond.



Virtual trips are also still very much part of the new normal. At the end of last month, year 12 law and politics students attended an online talk given by Parliament's education department. The students took part in a law making and debating workshop where they considered whether tuition fees for university should be scrapped. The students were joined by local MP Mims Davies who kindly answered their questions about how she started her career in politics.





Another highpoint for me this week was **thanking our tremendous year 8 open morning guides** who were so positive and helpful showing prospective parents round last month. **Mr Pearson** served them all a mug of hot chocolate by way of thanks. A very impressive group of young people.

There is more tremendous news this week about year 13 student **Amber Titchener** – she's going to star on CBBC's

<u>Saturday Mash-Up</u> tomorrow (Saturday). Amber will sing her new song 'Get Me' live, and will no doubt get involved in all of the fun of the show.


Finally, as reported by Mr Grant, the **boys' football first 11** beat Imberhorne 5-1. Player of the Match Olly Ally

Open evening calculator winner



Half-termly medical reminders


Mrs Nibloe writes:-
