Dear Parents,

As we draw close to the half term break it is good to reflect once again on the busy life of the school and all that is being accomplished.



On Tuesday of this week, the Department for Education made its first release of limited national 2018 examination data into the public domain. We are delighted to see confirmed the outstanding results of our students last year, placing our progress as very high in local and, indeed, national

comparisons. Our national percentile ranking as a school hasn't been released yet, but we know by looking at these figures that it will be tremendous – and certainly in the top 15%! Our 'Progress 8' figure of +0.4 means that almost half of the grades achieved at GCSE were above ambitious government expectations – and Progress 8 is the headline figure on which schools are now assessed.





Our year 7 students have settled in very well and enjoyed a **team building evening** last week which helped them get to know each other even better! It was also good to welcome new parents and others to our first **observatory evening** of the year which was very successful. Our **space education** status

continues to be much cherished and is a great feature here.



It was good to meet so many **year 11** parents again at our **parents' evening with subject teachers** this week. The **timing of this evening is significant** as discussions are able to reflect on how well the start to the year has gone together with advice ahead of the November mock examinations. It also

allows time to implement strategies sufficiently early in this crucial year. As ever, I am both struck and deeply grateful for the support you all give to your children and to the school. Such **strength of partnership** is an essential ingredient of success and also helps our young people face the inevitable pressures of 2018-19. We were delighted that **over 95% of parents** were able to make the parents' evening!



Our sporting activities and fixtures are well under way now and as extensive as ever.

Our new sports leaders were involved in an academy launch day last week and have also helped run a primary school basketball tournament.

We have several important memorial matches around this time of year,

three of which I was privileged to be present at.



Sackville and Imberhorne U14 players

On Friday 28th September we hosted the annual **Paul Keenor Memorial Rugby Game**, as reported in the last Sackville News.

On Thursday 4th October, in a reversal of last year's results, **Sackville rugby teams won both the memorial games against Imberhorne** held at East Grinstead Rugby Club. The U16s play for the **Barry Newman Cup** and the U14s for the **Chris Cooney Cup**. Barry

Newman was a longstanding head of PE at Imberhorne. Chris Cooney was a sport-loving Sackville student who sadly passed away in his final year at school.



Rugby was Chris' passion, and both the efforts put in by all four teams and the spirit in which the games were played would have made him proud. Whilst I feature in the photo here, I would like to point out that I take no credit for the fine victories; it was just great to support our teams!

Finally on Thursday of last week East Grinstead Town FC hosted the annual **Adam Dabell Memorial Football Match** between Imberhorne and Sackville. A decent crowd saw a high quality

game, which

this year **Imberhorne edged 2-0**, despite a number of chances for Sackville.

The point of the game of course is to commemorate Adam Dabell, an ex-Sackville student, who died suddenly after playing football due to an undiagnosed heart condition, and to raise awareness of this possibility in all young people.

It was a privilege for those present to watch the players from both schools approach the game in the right spirit. Sackville will be back in 2019 keen to win back the trophy.

community for their support in making health and social care the success that it is.





Disability access in East Grinstead and Lingfield

We have been contacted by Paul Johnson, Chairman of Disability Access - East Grinstead Area with this message.

Advice has been received from the Sussex Community Rail Partnership that Network Rail are preparing to put both East Grinstead and Lingfield Stations forward for priority funding from the Government's second tranche of 'Access for All' granting 2020-2024. Disability Access - East Grinstead Area have been campaigning for proper access for the mobility impaired to and from platform 1 at East Grinstead (and to and from platform 2 at Lingfield) since 2005. We have also been calling for better access to and from the Worth Way and upper station car park. This would be better accomplished by replacement of both the platform bridge and the Worth Way bridge with a dual purpose bridge, with lifts to the platforms and graduated ramping to the station forecourt.

In order to back up the application it is required to supply as much evidence of support as possible, this is to be submitted together with the application to the Department of Transport by 19th November. This will then be considered for feasibility study and announcements will be made as to successful stations in April 2019.

The present advice from Network Rail for any disabled person arriving on platform 1 is to attract the attention of a member of station staff, who then has to ring the supervisor for permission to escort the person over the tracks, which in itself is a violation of Health & Safety rules. There is no suggestion for those without physical impairment but with buggies, bikes or heavy loads to get over the bridge.

So, what is being requested is a simple statement supporting Disability Access - East Grinstead Area in its call for proper access, etc.
