Overall our **Year** 7s have made a very impressive start to their Sackville careers. Initially they were escorted around the school by our brilliant **buddy team from year 9**, but they mastered the difficulties of the school site so speedily they were soon able to dispense with this support.

This week, they have been sitting **Cognitive Ability Tests** (CATs) which require them to spend three lessons

completing an online battery of quizzes on our Chromebooks. They are taking the tests because once again **SATs** were cancelled this year, and the CATs will allow us to make sure we are giving each child the correct level of stretch and support. I would like to commend the year group on their excellent attitude to these assessments.

Meanwhile for year 7 parents, our series of information workshops started last Thursday, with Mr Treen's session on eLearning and eSafety.

On September 9th, we were finally able to host the **Teenage Cancer Trust** fundraiser which had been postponed twice. A **Sackville staff team** took on last year's **Forest Row U16s**. A close fought game saw the staff run out 2-1 winners, though there was lively debate at the end of the game as to whether the result was deserved! More importantly, a staggering £1600 was raised for the charity, which has supported a number of our students over the

last few years. I'd like to thank **Karen Young** and **James Moon** of the Forest Row team for organising such an enjoyable event, and also the **many local businesses** who offered such **generous raffle prizes**.




















COVID Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) for parents, autumn 2021

Mr Bush writes:-

My child has tested positive for Covid-19. What should I do next?

If the test taken was a lateral flow test, then you should book a PCR test for confirmation. Your child should selfisolate at home until the results of this PCR test is known, and if it is positive they must continue to self-isolate for the remainder of the isolation period. If it is negative they can return to school. Please keep the year office and attendance team up to date with the situation. Other members of the household are advised to book a PCR test as well but may continue with work or school whilst awaiting the results, unless advised otherwise by NHS Test and Trace. (See next question)

A member of our household has tested positive for Covid-19. Can my child still attend school?

The government recommendation is for everyone in the household to book a PCR test due their close contact with the infected person. It is not necessary to self-isolate whilst awaiting these results so your child can continue to attend school unless advised otherwise by NHS Test and Trace. However, we would ask that they complete a lateral flow test each day until there is no longer anyone infectious in the household. Spare lateral flow kits can be collected from year offices or the main reception.

My child has been informed that they are a close contact of somebody who has tested positive for covid-19. What should I do?

The government recommendation is for you to book your child a PCR test. It is not necessary to self-isolate whilst awaiting these results so your child can continue to attend school. However, we would ask that they complete a lateral flow test each day until there is no longer anyone infectious in the household. Spare lateral flow kits can be collected from year offices or the main reception.

Is my child allowed to wear a face covering in school?

Yes, your child is free to wear face covering whenever and wherever they wish.

When should lateral flow tests be taken?

Please ensure lateral flow tests are taken every Wednesday and Sunday and report the result to the NHS via <u>this link</u>. Remember, lateral flow tests are only to be used to identify asymptomatic cases, i.e. those who do **not** have symptoms. Anyone displaying Covid symptoms should immediately self-isolate and book a PCR test. Spare lateral flow kits can be collected from year offices or the main reception.

How long will lateral flow testing continue?

Lateral flow testing will continue for as long as we are advised to by central government.

Vaccinations for 12-15 year olds: Sussex NHS message for parents

This message is from the local NHS.

The Government has announced that people aged 12 to 15 in England will be offered one dose of the Pfizer/BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine, following advice from the four UK Chief Medical Officers (CMOs).

The government has accepted the advice of the four UK CMOs and the NHS is preparing to deliver a schools-based vaccination programme, which is the successful model used for vaccinations including for HPV and Diphtheria, Tetanus and Polio (DTP), supported by GPs and community pharmacies. Invitations for vaccination will begin next week.

In Sussex, plans have been developed to run vaccination sessions in schools and over the next six weeks each school will be offered a visit to provide the vaccination for 12 to 15 year old students. Parental, guardian or carer consent will be sought by vaccination healthcare staff prior to vaccination in line with existing school vaccination programmes.

We will write out to every parent, guardian or carer with the details of this session for our school, the consent process, and next steps.
