## Dear Parents and Carers

I would like to begin this week by once again saying **how well the students have settled in to the new COVID-secure ways of working**. We always have high expectations of our students, but I can emphatically say that they have surpassed even these. I would like to thank all parents and carers for their support in making the first month of the school year so successful.

Our **open day** was a little different this year of course. We used our second school **INSET day** to invite seven separate groups of up to sixty parents and prospective students to enjoy a **safe physically distanced presentation and tour of the school**. Using the INSET day meant that our open day was not at the expense of students' learning.

Our **senior sixth form students** were magnificent in leading the tours and our visitors left having been **able to talk to teachers in every subject area** and get a **real flavour of the school**. We have now also released **two videos** of the day on our website which may be of interest. The **virtual tour** is particularly enjoyable!

We continue to live in challenging times of course, and as a result **we have** decided to change how we feedback to parents of year 11 students this term.

It will not be possible to run parents' evening in its usual format and regrettably we are therefore replacing the evening with an alternative that still allows parents to receive feedback pertinent to each subject as well as engaging in information about the upcoming mock exams.

On **Friday 9th October**, students will receive a sheet with an **attitude to learning grade** and a **short concise comment** for each subject. The comment will give advice on where to focus in the run up to mocks. We will **not include a current 'working at' grade** at this time; these will be **sent home after the mock exams**. As already shared, the mock exams have been brought forward to earlier than usual , now commencing week beginning **Monday 9<sup>th</sup> November**; this will enable the 'working at' grades to reach you **well before the end of term** and be based on solid evidence.

In addition you will be invited to attend a virtual meeting with Mr Millican and Mrs Sands, to discuss

- $\hfill\square$  what support has been put in place leading up to this set of mock exams
- $\hfill\square$  how parents can best support their child through the mock period
- □ how you can receive feedback from teachers, if you have a specific subject concern/question.

This meeting will be held several times during the week beginning **12th October**, so that you are able to choose a slot that suits you. We will also **record this meeting** for any parents who cannot attend a live meeting. More information will follow in due course.



I am pleased to see how well the **canteen ordering system** is currently running. If there are students who are struggling making packed lunches in the mornings, I am happy to say we are now in a position where our canteen can serve more meals than it currently is. It is an excellent service which ensures that your child receives her/his food **very promptly** at the start of the lunch break as it is delivered to their particular zone.

I would like to thank parents who contributed to our **Chromebook Fund** last term. We have purchased four new machines which will soon be available for students who do not have access to online learning materials at home.

Please can I ask that **parents and carers park carefully and legally** even though it is for a short time?
