Dear Parents,

I hope everyone has had a good summer break as we now return refreshed to begin another school year. I would particularly like to **welcome warmly to Sackville our new year 7 students and their parents**; it is a real pleasure to have you with us. Welcome also to those **year 12** students and their parents joining us from other schools.

I regret to begin by having to share that **Andrew Smith**, age 13, lost his brave battle with cancer in August. We are all immensely saddened by this news. Sackville is a tightly knit community in which we support each other through both celebratory and the most challenging of times and this is undoubtedly one of the latter.



Andrew will be remembered for so many things, not least the dignity with which he faced his illness over the last year. Noone present will forget the charity basketball game he graced last November, and the huge cheers every time he sank a basket – which was every shot, for as usual he never missed. All of our staff count it as an honour to have worked with him in the short time he

was at Sackville. So many of his peers are proud to have counted him as a friend.

We have lost a young man of immense talent and promise, who grabbed every opportunity his brief life offered and wrung every last ounce from it. Andrew was a true example and inspiration to all of us, and our thoughts are with his family now. Andrew, you will be missed but never forgotten.

It is extremely hard to follow such news, but it is, of course, important to share all that has been taking place at Sackville over the summer.

Our **premises team** have, as ever, been very busy with various projects and in ensuring that the school is **well maintained**. Significant **painting work** has taken place and I am very grateful to the dedicated band of **students and ex-students** who have given their all to this end.

Our Junior Leadership Team have been requesting a covered canopy area for outside



eating and we are very pleased to have had this installed by the English block. A separate catering pod will also be in operation soon to service this and reduce the queues in the canteen.



Another key project this summer has been a significant expansion of **solar panel installation** on our roofs. This important increase in renewable energy use is a positive environmental step forward for us.



Our sixth form team has been working very hard over the last couple of weeks to ensure that our **new year 12 students are carefully guided in their choices** and ready to make a **crisp start** at the beginning of term. Year 13 students are being

supported with **university** and **apprenticeship applications**, including an **Oxbridge-focussed group** which has been preparing hard for a while now.



Far beyond the shores of the UK, a group of sixth form students accompanied by **Mr Langford** and **Ms Jeffcoat**, travelled to **Malawi** on a **World Challenge** trip where they ascended **Mulanje Mountain**, worked at **Madziabango School** and undertook a safari at **Liwonde National Park**. The photographs are a small reflection of their incredible experience and Mr Langford was delighted to share the wonders of his home country with our students.

Back in the UK, parents may have been aware of Sackville's participation in the CBBC young chef competition called 'Step Up To The Plate' which was televised over the summer.

The grand final was shown last Friday morning and our very own Mac Lloyd-Skinner won the 'Head Chef' title which





Congratulations also to Sackville's Joseph Boyle who was a very worthy participant.

The anxious wait for **examination results** finally came to a close in August as students received their **A level**, **vocational** and **GCSE results** which, I must say, were exceptional!

At A level, half of all grades were at B, A or A* and over 90% achieved the higher C+ grades in English, Maths and Geography, with 83% in History and in Physics. No fewer

than 20 students achieved an A* or A grade in Maths alone which is outstanding.



The students once again coped remarkably well with the new, more challenging exams and it is testament to their **staff** who prepared them thoroughly and to you, the **parents**, for your tireless support.



Top achievers include Grace de Souza who achieved a fantastic 4 A* grades and a further 11 students who achieved straight A/A*s: Sam Akehurst, Imogen Booth, Mark Botha, Jenny Brockbank, Olivia Burton, Ellie Bush, Alice Holman, Casper Parsonage, Will Roberts Percy, Ben Sweetman and Marnie Trewern. A further 7 students achieved 2 A/A*s: Hollie Barden, Tatyana Koleva, Treya Lufu, Ollie Moon, Emily Phipps, Tom Taylor and Melissa Turner.

Such strong results have led to great success in securing **apprenticeship**, **first choice university**, **medical** and **veterinary** school places.

A week later, year 11 students were receiving their GCSE results.

All of the GCSEs were on the new more demanding 9-1 scale this year and the **students rose magnificently** to the challenge. With highlights including **8 out of 10 students achieving strong GCSE passes in English and also in Maths** we can confidently claim that at Sackville '**Together**



we Achieve'.

Not only were our own expectations exceeded; the students achieved **comfortably above government benchmarks**. Hard-working students of all abilities continue to make great



strides at Sackville. We could tell from the way these students approached their exams in the summer that we were in for some **strong results** and I would like to **congratulate the students once again** for the **tremendous work** they put in over the whole of last year. None of this would have been possible without the support of Sackville's amazing **staff** and you, the **parents**.

Uniform / Mobile Phones – a message from Mr Street, Deputy Headteacher

I hope everyone has enjoyed the long summer break and managed to dodge the all too frequent rain showers.

It was great to see the new Year 7 arrive today with such enthusiasm and looking splendid in their new Sackville uniform. The new academic year is an important time to remind all students and parents about our uniform expectations and also the changes we have made to our mobile phone policy so everyone can start the term looking great and using their phones in an appropriate way.

In addition to the above it is also worth noting that:

- **u** no jewellery other than a wrist watch and a set of plain stud earrings is acceptable. Any other piercings must be removed.
- □ shirts must be worn tucked in.
- □ nail varnish and acrylic nails are not permitted.
- extreme haircuts and colours are not permitted. Grade 2 or below and tram lines of any description are not allowed. For girls, hair colour must be natural and dip dye is not acceptable.
- □ Make up by girls in year 9 or above must be discreet, particularly eye make-up.

Mobile Phones

As part of our ongoing review of standards and expectations we have updated our mobile phone policy for September 2019.

We recognise that mobile phones, cameras and other digital devices are now an integral part of our culture and can be of considerable value to aid learning and for personal safety. However, balanced with this are the need to focus on learning and to safeguard students and staff from cyber bullying, inappropriate use of the Internet and telecommunications, and the misuse of social media such as Twitter, Facebook, Snapchat and Instagram.

After thorough consultation with all stakeholders (students, parents and staff) the school is taking a modified, measured approach to mobile phones. Mobile phones will not be permitted for use during lesson changeovers and whilst in lessons or registration without the teacher's permission. They can be used responsibly at social times, break and lunch. Although phone use is permitted at these times, students who bring their phones to school do so at their own risk. The school has no insurance in place for mobile phone loss, damage or theft.

This approach allows students to possess a mobile phone during the day and ensures their personal safety to and from school. Students will be expected to use their mobiles responsibly during social times and will be educated about how best to do this through our comprehensive Learning for Life programme. It also allows them to be used as an educational tool / organiser when permitted by staff whilst also avoiding unnecessary distractions to learning at other times.

In order to ensure that mobile phones do not disrupt learning, any students using their technological devices in the corridor during lesson change over or in a lesson/registration time when not permitted will receive a mobile phone point. This will be logged on our information system, SIMS.

Three or more points in a week will result in that student receiving a phone ban in school for the following week. Parents/carers will be contacted by the relevant year team and in consultation with them one of the following will be apply for that whole week:

- 1. The phone is confiscated by the parents during school hours (i.e. it is left safely at home);
- 2. The mobile phone is brought into school and handed into the year office for safe keeping at the beginning of each day and then collected at the end of the school day.

We are asking parents to support the school in educating students with regard to appropriate and responsible mobile phone use by avoiding contact via mobile phone with your child during the school day. Should you need to contact your child then please do through our reception or the relevant year office, where staff are always happy to assist in any way they can.

As always, I thank you for supporting us in ensuring that all Sackville students are really proud of their appearance and also using their mobile phones and other technological devices appropriately.

Toucan Crossing

After a summer of temporary traffic lights, the new toucan crossing in front of the school on Lewes Road is ready to go. We have supported West Sussex County Council in constructing this as it will make safer the journeys of students to school. However we would encourage students and parents to remember that **the safest way to cross the A22 is via the subway**.


