
Year Group Communities

Our Curriculum

Broad, balanced and meeting the needs of our community.

We aim to provide an engaging knowledge-based curriculum that allows all students to achieve their potential regardless of their ability or talents. We provide clear progression routes which prepare students for the world of work and to live fulfilling adult lives as global citizens, leaving students with a lifelong love for learning.

Students in Year 7 will follow a broad and balanced curriculum in 25 one-hour lessons per week. Our expert teachers plan lessons to provide just the right amount of support and challenge so that students make excellent progress.

Our curriculum includes:

- English, maths and science, three lessons a week
- a modern foreign language French or German or Spanish, three lessons a week
- design & technology resistant materials, food, textiles and systems and control, two lessons a week
- PE, two lessons a week
- history and geography, two lessons a week
- beliefs & values, art, drama, music, and computer science, one lesson a week

Each day starts with dedicated tutor time where we deliver our comprehensive Learning for Life curriculum.







Beyond The Classroom

Opportunities to explore every students' gifts, talents and interests.

To enhance students' enjoyment of learning we are proud to offer an immense range of extra-curricular activities. These wide ranging activities not only engage and enthuse our young people but provide cultural experiences, leadership opportunities, a chance to compete and perform but most importantly make happy students and leave lasting memories.

We encourage every student to:

- Join an after school club e.g sport, music, drama, science, history and geography
- Do a trip or visit with at least one being a residential
- Take part in a whole school event e.g the school show or gym and dance display
- Fundraise for a charity
- Take part in Curriculum Enhancement Week
- Take on a leadership role

How WE communicate with you:

- We communicate with our families in a variety of ways. Our weekly families bulletin provides regular updates and highlights key dates and events in addition to features on wellbeing and safeguarding.
- Student successes are shared through our half termly Sackville News and regular updates can be found on our website https://sackvilleschool.org.uk/ and social media accounts.
- Academic progress is communicated twice a year via monitoring grades or a written report and parents have an opportunity to discuss their child's progress once a year at consultation evenings. We also regularly invite parents and carers into school to celebrate the achievements of their children.



How YOU can communicate with us:

- Day-to-day contact with all staff is normally by email. However, our year assistants are nonteaching so are always available to speak to you if you wish to drop by in person or over the phone.
- We always welcome feedback from our parents and run a parents' focus group which is an excellent think tank for scrutiny and creativity.

Student Achievements - Examination results

Our vision is for students to reach their full potential in all aspects of life and learning. We are particularly proud of our students academic achievements no matter what their starting points. We believe that by living our values every day, all of our student have the ability to be hugely successful.

Peformance and Achievements include:

- Sackville students consistently exceed national performance at GCSE, A Level and vocational qualifications
- Students progress at GCSE is consistently within the top 20% of schools nationally
- Achievement in both GCSE English and Maths are strong
- In 2022 33% of Year 11 grades awarded were the highest grades 9-7
- In 2022 our Year 13 students did exceptionally well enabling the vast majority who apply to go on to their first choice university

- 30% of grades were A*/A; 67% A*-B and 87% were A*-C
- In recent years, a number of our students have been offered places at either Oxbridge Universities, alongside many more who go on to Russell group universities
- Other students have gone on to highly-regarded apprenticeships and employment
- We have gained national recognition for our examination results over a number of years
