Starting in Year 7

Pastoral Care



Sackville is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young people.

Each student is a member of a specific tutor group and the tutor will be the person who will work closely with the individual. This, we believe, is vital in a large establishment. The tutor is a member of a year team, led by a year leader with

a year assistant and supported by a member of the senior leadership team (SLT). The year team will know their students very well and will stay with them as they progress through the school.

The tutor and year assistant provide the first point of contact for parents and all staff can be contacted directly via email and addresses are displayed on our website.

At Sackville School we encourage good behaviour through positive reinforcement and reward. We recognise good work through regular high quality marking and feedback, ensuring that students understand their strengths and how to improve. We concentrate on supporting them to fulfil their potential and be the very best they can.

Bullying is unacceptable; our policy on this is clear. Should it occur, students and their parents are always encouraged to raise the matter with a teacher. Cases are dealt with firmly, swiftly and sensitively.

KS3 Curriculum and Beyond

At Sackville we aim to provide an engaging knowledge-based curriculum that allows all students to achieve their potential regardless of their ability or talents, ensuring as a school that we fight for every child. Our curriculum will provide clear progression routes which prepare students for the world of work and to live fulfilling adult lives as global citizens, leaving students with a lifelong love for learning.

Year 7 students will follow a condensed two-year Key Stage 3 providing pace and challenge. The programme of study encompasses all National Curriculum subjects.

Sackville currently runs a weekly timetable of 25 one-hour lessons.

All year 7 and 8 students study:

- English, maths and science, three lessons a week
- a modern foreign language French or German or Spanish, three lessons a week
- design & technology resistant materials, food, textiles and systems and control, two lessons a week
- **PE,** two lessons a week
- history and geography, two lessons a week
- beliefs & values, art, drama, music, and computer science, one lesson a week

Guidance for the future is a key focus, with the vast majority of our students staying on to our successful sixth form where they have the opportunity to participate in work experience both in the UK and abroad.

Extra-Curricular Activities

To enhance students' enjoyment of learning we are proud to offer an immense range of extra-curricular activities.

This year, our year 7 students have the opportunity to join clubs in **sport, music, drama, science, history and geography.** In addition all students will begin **Sackville's PiXL Edge programme** to develop and accredit students' attitudes, attributes and skills essential for employability and life. The scheme focusses on 5 key attributes: **Leadership, Organisation, Resilience, Initiative, and Communication.**

Sackville creates at least one **school production every year.** These have recently included the smash hits *Hairspray, Our House, Back to the 80s, Fame* and most recently *Joseph*. In addition to this the music department also holds a **traditional Christmas carol service** at St Swithun's and runs well attended concerts in both the spring and summer terms.

Every July, the timetable is collapsed for our annual **Curriculum Enhancement Week (CEW)** where students in years 7-10 and 12 take part in a range of activities, trips and visits to enrich their learning journey.

Throughout the year, Sackville staff run a large number of trips and visits both in school time and in the holidays. These have included **ski trips** to France and the USA, a **music tour** to the Italian Lakes, a **sports tour** of Barbados and **World Challenge expeditions** over the summer to Africa, China, Brazil, India and South-East Asia.

Home-School Contact

Clear communication between Sackville and parents and carers is key to the educational success and emotional well-being of our students.

We communicate with our parents in a variety of ways. Day-to-day contact with all staff is normally by email. However, our year assistants are non-teaching so are always available to speak to you if you wish to drop by in person or over the phone.

Academic progress is communicated termly via monitoring grades or a written report and parents have an opportunity to discuss their child's progress once a year at parents' evening with subject teachers (twice in year 11). We also regularly invite parents and carers into school to celebrate the achievements of their children.

Our website keeps parents, students and the wider community up to date with all that is going on and contains an updated copy of the school calendar as well as the ever popular **'Sackville News'**, our fortnightly bulletin in which the Headteacher shares our students' successes and keeps parents well-informed about the progress of the school.

We always welcome feedback from our parents and run a parents' focus group which is an excellent think tank for scrutiny and creativity.

Target Setting

We use a robust system of target setting to support every child in achieving their best.

Firstly we set a minimum expected grade (MEG) using their Key Stage 2 achievements and wider information, then we challenge them to achieve one grade higher than their MEG. In this way they aspire to achieve the best they can.

We monitor students' performance very regularly against both the baseline and the targets, ensuring that we provide appropriate intervention and support.
