


The community also has to face difficult challenges and last month, it gathered in very sad circumstances at the funeral of Paul Keenor who attended Sackville from 2003 to 2010. Deputy Head Neil Feist felt privileged to speak at the occasion where so many shared in the tragic loss of a young life. Last week we also heard of the untimely death of another former student, Matthew Cox. The loss of these men at such an age has had a profound effect on the school community. Our thoughts and condolences are with families and friends at this time.



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Together We Achieve



August also saw the release of **examination results** to many of our students ranging from years 9 to 13. Our A level results arrived first and saw students achieving a fine set of results and university places. We were delighted that **half of all A level grades were at B and above**, which is an impressive achievement. **Three quarters of grades were at C and above** and the overall pass rate was over 99%. 17 students achieved an A or A* grade in maths alone! We are now busily analysing the data by subject and by student, looking at the progress made since GCSE as such detail helps us to plan lessons and courses carefully for the new year.

Particular congratulations go to Rohan Pritchard, Laura van der Heijden and Ella Wooding who achieved 2 A*s and an A, closely followed by Scott Latham, Rebecca Stovell and Emily Thomas on 1 A* and 2 As and Michael Clements and Conor Thornley Gibson on 3 As. There are, of course, many others worthy of praise for their excellent progress.

I am sure that many will have heard about our **GCSE success** or read about it in the local press. We achieved a **double figure increase** on the previous year's good results such that **73% of our year**

11 students gained at least 5 strong passes at grade C+ including English and maths against a county average of 61%. Such results place us amongst the very top schools in West Sussex and the cross-border locality this year. A quarter of all grades were at A/A* and 99% achieved 5 or more A*-G grades which shows a real sense of success for all which is what the school stands for. The students did themselves proud, and staff and parents gave tremendous support throughout. This follows on from our extremely positive Ofsted report and reinforces the judgements made by the inspectors. They were keen to know our results and were delighted on hearing them.

Brin Martin, **West Sussex Strategic Commissioner for Learning**, wrote to us saying: "At West Sussex, we are equally celebrating your outstanding results and the incredible journey at Sackville. I am absolutely delighted for the staff and especially the students".



The whole year group deserves much praise for this and they are now well set-up for further studies and careers. I am delighted that so many have chosen to return to our thriving sixth form and please do encourage any post-GCSE youngsters you know to consider us at this crucial stage in their education.

For the first time in the school's history, both English and maths saw **over 80%** of students achieving at least a grade C this summer against a national average of 65% for English and 63% for maths. **Over 86%** achieved at least expected progress from end of primary school which is tremendous. Bearing in mind the well-publicised increase of 8 marks in the C/D maths boundary, to achieve 82% C+ in this subject was marvellous.

Of equal importance is the value added achievement of the students; the progress they have made since sitting their primary

school and of key stage 2 tests. Well done to the following top performers in this category:- Jessica Argy, Katie Balmer, Tom Beswick, Glen Chandler, Oliver Harris, Gianluca Inserra, Jasmine Mayne-Clark, Lia Raymond, Steven Sayell, Isabella Sterling, Abigail Tamakloe, Henry Thompson, Zach Thompson, Rebecca Turner and Robert Ure.

During the holiday period we also received the great news that we have gained a 'Good Schools' Guide' Award for 2015. This is a prestigious national award and commends the school on its progress, with particular praise for boys' progress in design and technology at GCSE. This came hot on the heels of the Sainsbury's School Games Gold Award gained in July.
