FOREWORD FROM MRS VALENTINE (Head of Sixth Form)

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We are pleased to let you know that sixth form plans for the return of year 12 are going well - we are really excited to see our students again, albeit in a limited way. Before I outline information about these plans however, I would like to address an issue that has been at the forefront of the minds of our sixth form staff and students, as well as our larger school community - the issue of **Black Lives Matter.** We take racism of any sort very seriously and recognise the need to build a truly anti-racist school and curriculum for students. The student head team responded very

swiftly to the killing of George Floyd and has already met with Mr Watson and me.

Here is a statement from year 12 student, Ben Kenward, a member of the Student Head Team:

In reinforcing Sackville's zero-tolerance policy to racism and all other forms of prejudice, the Sixth Form Leadership Team alongside Mrs Valentine and Mr Watson are looking into what else we can do to build on existing practice.

To ensure we have the full support of the Sackville community, we will in due course share with students and parents further ideas for refining our anti-racist curriculum.

Year 12 return to school: We want to reassure you that it is very important to us that your child feels safe and secure on his/her return to school and that parents/carers feel reassured too. Mr Grant and senior members of staff, along with the premises team have worked very hard to *minimise* risk to students and staff



alike. I do hope the details below go some way to reassuring you. Please can I ask you also to read the main school **<u>Sackville News</u>** which outlines in greater depth the health and safety measures taken and plans in place.

Document 1: Year 12 class timetable, week of 22nd June - please see document attached

This document shows the confirmed timetable and scheduling for classes. I would be grateful if you and your son/daughter could check carefully when the KS5 classes take place. The lessons are in specially designated classrooms, with places set out adhering strictly to social distancing.

Document 2: Progression exam timetable - please see document attached

These exams will be run online, not in school. This will ensure as many students as possible can access them at the appointed time and feel as safe and secure as possible by completing these exams in their home surroundings. We recognise at these times there is no ideal solution but hope this enables students to plan ahead for computer access on the specific days of their exams. *Queries and questions about the exams in the first instance should be directed to the relevant subject teacher and department, not to the sixth form team*. Mr Watson and I, along with form tutors, are of course available in case of queries that cannot be solved by the subject specialists.

THIS WEEK'S NEWS AND MESSAGES

Year 13 - Important UCAS messages from Ms Bach:

With the 18th June reply deadline fast approaching, it's time for many of you to make your decisions. If you received decisions from all of your university choices on or before **4th June 2020**, you need to reply to any offers **by next Thursday**, **18th June 2020** (except if you are using Extra to find a place).



With COVID-19 disrupting lots of plans, we know this decision may be more difficult than expected. Over the coming days, UCAS will be doing everything they can to help you make the right decision, including:

• Working with Universities UK to provide top tips and support students' decision-making.

They have emailed all applicants with an 18th June deadline, but in case you have missed it, **here's a copy** for you to share.

• Sending helpful reminders as the deadline fast approaches. UCAS are sending messages by email, text, and across social media.

Remember – if you do not reply by 18:00 on 18 June, your offers will be automatically declined.

Our advice is a decision is better than no decision - many of the reasons you chose to go to university or college are still the same and will remain long after COVID-19. With new guidelines and advice, universities and colleges are putting plans in place to welcome students starting their studies this autumn.

Introducing Clearing Plus

For the first time, from 6 July, students in Clearing will be able to see a list of courses they've been matched to in Track, using their application, what unis have told us they're looking for, and what previous applicants have gone on to study based on their grades and choices.

Students are in control, so if they find a course they want to be considered for, they can send an expression of interest which means the uni or college can then reach out to discuss things further.

The search tool will still be available, with over 30,000 course options. To find out how it works go to <u>www.ucas.com</u>
