FOREWORD FROM MRS VALENTINE (Head of Sixth Form)

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Next week we will be **welcoming back year 12**. We look forward immensely to being reunited with our students. We hope that you are all reassured that our environment is safe, well staffed and **risk is minimised**. We do hope the students make every effort to attend school for their appointed lessons. The social aspect of seeing friends, albeit in a strictly socially distanced manner, is equally as important as lesson attendance. Lesson content will be geared towards preparation for the progression exam.

Our progress in examining our sixth form curriculum for **Black Lives Matter** (BLM) is now gathering pace thanks to the commitment of students and staff to engage in honest and open discussions and reflective evaluation. The current student head team, along with our outgoing Head Girl and Head Boy (Lily and Ayo), are holding a socially distanced meeting with us later this term to help form an action plan for the delivery of SMSC issues to sixth form students that not only include BLM and wider BAME issues, but also the raising awareness of other important topical issues including gender, modern day slavery, FGM, gender equality and immigration. We are keen to discuss these challenging issues with our sixth form students and look forward to updating you on our progress.

Since school closure in March, the main tasks of teachers and support staff have been to deliver high quality online learning and establish regular pastoral contact. The sixth form tutors, leaders and support staff have also been discussing with students their future plans and assisting with university queries and personal statement writing. This afternoon, sixth form staff have undertaken an online



training session about the UCAS (university) application process. Other training undertaken includes the delivery of the Extended Project Qualification.

On the subject of university applications, I do hope students intending to go to university are **enrolling on online open days** (advertised weekly in the bulletin). Students must enroll on these themselves. There may be some face to face open days in September/October but I would stress that attendance at school will be an absolute priority in year 13. It is advisable to do as much preparatory work as possible this term.

Progression exams will take place online during the **weeks of 29th June and 6th July**. Any queries should be addressed to the subject teachers; if the query still remains unresolved, please then contact your form tutor. I would also like to stress that completion of these exams is not optional but obligatory.

Finally, I would like to say thank you to both students and parents. We are pleased at the excellent work ethic of the vast majority of students. We know that there are many pressures placed on students at this time and remote learning is not always seamless and practical, but the level of engagement from students has been high. We thank you wholeheartedly for supporting our efforts in the delivery of online learning. Without your support, we would not be able to operate this system effectively. It may seem that some of my messages are repetitive in their requests and even negative at times. However, I would like to say how much it means to us that you support us so fully in continuing with delivering our sixth form education.

For the first time, from 6 July, students in Clearing will be able to see a list of courses they've been matched to in Track, using their application, what unis have told us they're looking for, and what previous applicants have gone on to study based on their grades and choices.

Students are in control, so if they find a course they want to be considered for, they can send an expression of interest which means the uni or college can then reach out to discuss things further.
