FOREWORD FROM MRS VALENTINE (Head of Sixth Form)



We would like to start by commending and congratulating the sixth form on their responsible behaviour around school during the second lockdown. Mask wearing has become the new normal, along with operating within the rules of the bubbles in the school.

Additionally, I have also noted around town that students are behaving very considerately when walking on the pavements and are not operating in large groups - something which can be intimidating for the general public at this time.

We have made some vital technological improvements to our sixth form bubble and are now able to hold large group presentations in the sixth form centre. Finn in year 13 kindly tested our new equipment last week, giving us a run through of his fantastic EPQ presentation.



Last Tuesday, Mrs Smith (Futures leader) held an apprenticeship workshop run by the University of Portsmouth - this aimed to give students a clear idea of choices and options available to them, should they not wish to follow the traditional degree path.







We were proud to attend the presentation showcase in the Sackville Centre of the work done by our year 12 Level 2 students on the COPE course. We were impressed by the standard of work they produced on this course led by Mr Watson, Mr Endersby and Mr Davies.

There are a lot of important messages and I am anxious both parents and students read these. I have marked clearly whether they are appropriate for year 12 or year 13/14 students.

Year 12 messages

EPQ: The EPQ programme is well underway now. We are delighted to announce we have more than 60 year 12 students enrolled on the EPQ programme. The vast majority are now matched to a supervisor. We have an exciting array of project topics, ranging from artifacts to scientific research documents. Our next EPQ lessons will take place on Monday 7th and Tuesday 8th December.

Year 13 messages

ASSEMBLY: We are asking all year 13/14 students to attend the one assembly of this term on **Wednesday 9th December at 8.30am** in their form room. Mr Watson and I will be running the assembly and there will also be some sports presentations during this assembly. A register will be taken.

UCAS Applications are progressing very well. To date, we have 60 applications in progress, with 22 already submitted. These students are now receiving and awaiting offers. Our UCAS clinics run via Zoom with a University of Sussex tutor have been very well attended. Should you require an appointment to discuss your personal statement with a tutor from university, please let us know as soon as possible so we can see if there are any appointments still available.

Dates and timeline for UCAS applications: Whilst the official deadline is 15th January for UCAS applications, we would strongly urge students to apply in the



month of November. Many offers are given early. Once the application is submitted, students are then free to concentrate fully on their studies.

Who to ask for help for UCAS issues: All form tutors have undertaken UCAS training and should be the student's first port of call for help. Additionally, Mrs Bush (mbush@sackvilleschool.org.uk) and I (hvalentine@sackvilleschool.org.uk) have expertise in this area.

Year 13 reports and predicted grades: Reports and predicted grades will be issued to parents and students by email on **Friday 11th December**.

YEAR 13 MOCKS: Please note these important exams will take place in the week beginning **18th January 2021** - students should be forward planning for these exams now.

Careers and university opportunities for year 12/13/14: As usual there are many exciting opportunities available for year 12 and year 13/14 students below and at the end of this bulletin. I would urge students to look at these carefully and take part in some of these courses offered. As it is now difficult to gain face to face placements, universities and employers are increasingly accepting virtual experiences and look for evidence of this in applications.
