FOREWORD FROM MRS VALENTINE (Head of Sixth Form)



As we approach half term, I would like to thank students for their cooperation with adapting to our sixth form 'bubble' arrangements that have now been in place since the beginning of September. Our students have been acceptant of the arrangements and we thank them for their cooperation. One recurring piece of feedback is that the building is continuously cold. We would ask students to dress warmly for school and always have a coat or warm jumper with them. In order to minimise the virus spreading, it is important that we keep the building well ventilated and the only

way we can do this is by keeping windows and doors open. I would also like to remind students of the importance of following our rule to wear masks in the corridors when travelling round the school.

Year 12 EPQ launch and Year 12 University launch: This important day will take place on Thursday 8th October, periods 3/4/5 in the main hall. Attendance is compulsory for level 3 students as outlined in my email earlier today.

Assessment and Attitude to Learning grades:

Year 13/14: Next week year 13/14 will receive via email an Attitude to Learning grade and a current predicted grade for all subjects. Please note it states 'current' predicted grade, so there is still opportunity for this grade to change.



Year 12 and year 13 following year 12 curriculum: These students will receive an Attitude to Learning grade only, as it is too early to assess progress in a subject in a well rounded and meaningful way. This A2L grade is important as it gives an indication of the effort and commitment shown to the subject. These grades mark the first stage of our assessment and reporting process for the academic year. In case of queries about these grades, please contact your son/daughter's form tutor.

Year 12/13/14: Eating in the Sackville centre and B01 library - I would like to clarify that eating in lesson times in these rooms is not allowed. The Bistro is always open and available for students and is a designated social and eating area. However, the Sackville centre and B01 libraries are strictly quiet and silent work areas respectively.

Year 13/14 UCAS: In the two weeks following half term, we will be holding 1:1 UCAS statement clinics with professionals from the University of Sussex. To gain space on one of these 1:1 tutorials, students will have to show they have completed an initial draft of their personal statement. A separate letter with booking details and procedure will follow.

Do Human Rights Matter More Than Public Health? Lessons from the COVID-19 and HIV Pandemics

COVID-19 has pushed many of us to ask ourselves: Is public health more important than my personal freedom? Contact tracing, mandatory quarantine and isolation have been among the basic measures for controlling COVID-19 and other pandemics in the past. But are these measures infringing on our basic human rights? To what extent is it possible to protect our freedom and our health? It turns out that marginalised communities that have been at the forefront of HIV prevention (including LGBTQ+, sex workers and drug users) can teach us a lot about protecting both our health and our freedoms. This session will explore the role of our individual freedoms and collective responsibility in the pursuit for public health.
