Students will have finished their coursework, which equates to 60% of their overall art grade. They will be prepared for their externally set paper in January and have the necessary skills and understanding of how their final exam will work and what they can achieve in the 10 hours.	60% coursework internally marked and feedback given to students on areas to improve for their ESA next year

Spr 1	Externally Set Exam Project	All art GCSE students must complete an externally set exam (ESA) project and exam. They have a much shorter window of time than with previous projects and work produced should be far more independent and personal to them than in the past.	The externally set exam project is always the last part of the course and should demonstrate the highest quality of work they can produce.	Students can harness skills from previous projects and use these to produce independent outcomes. This project can have a huge impact on students' grades and often showcases their best work. It is also very good practice for those that wish to take art further at A Level.	40% of their overall grade will be based on the preparatory work leading up to the exam and the final piece itself. The final exam happens in March/April and is 10 hours long with a 5 hour prep day.
