# The application process

- Apply for five courses, usually the same course at five different institutions
- Write ONE personal statement to accompany the application form
- Guidance for the statement is in the booklet students received today
- Fill in one application form

# Timeline

<b>1st October 2021</b>	<b>Conservatoire applications</b>
<b>15th October 2021</b>	<b>Oxbridge / Vet Med / Dentistry / Medicine applications</b>
<b>26th January 2022</b>	<b>All other applications</b>

However - we advise the majority of students submit applications between 15th October - 1st December.

Meeting our internal deadline of 29th November means we can guarantee we can check the application and authorise it to be sent BEFORE the end of the autumn term.

# Courses with extra requirements

- Portfolio courses - architecture / fashion / product design / art / photography / media
- Portfolios should be prepared over the summer and discussed and adapted throughout year 13 in accordance with portfolio requirements from universities
- Entrance exams - law / medicine / Oxbridge courses
- Interview / audition courses - most healthcare sector courses / drama / Oxbridge
- Work experience requirements - teaching / health and social care professions

# The statement

- The statement goes with the application to the university via the UCAS portal
- Universities do not know the other four institutions where a candidate has applied
- Should be linked to the course
- Students should be working on that over the summer - drafting and redrafting

# How do I choose a course?

- What would I like to study for 3 years? What motivates me? What am I good at and what do I enjoy? Are there certain aspects of that subject that interest me?
- Where would I like to study? Do I want to be near home but live away from home? Do I want to live at home? Do I want to be able to come home for weekends?
- Do I want a campus or non-campus university?





# Entrance qualifications

- You should have a cross section of university choices with different entry criteria
- Student should discuss this with both parents and tutors on receipt of progression exams results

# Funding for uni courses

Tuition fees loan (approx £9000 pa)

Maintenance loan - sliding scale dependent on household income and where you are living while you are studying.

## **2021/22 maintenance loan range:**

£3,516 - household income over £58,220 - student living at home whilst studying

£12,382 - household income under £25,000 - student living away from home whilst studying in London
