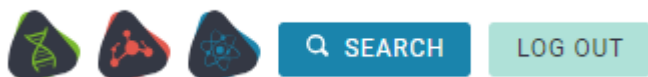
The website is <https://www.my-gcsescience.com/login/>

This website contains video explanations specifically tailored to their AQA specification, includes extra videos for those pupils studying the separate (triple) science subjects, and more importantly providing low stakes multiple choice quizzes and more rigorous practice exam questions (with answers) for pupils to check their memory and understanding.

2. Electricity

In addition to this resource, we have also created some electronic flashcards and knowledge organisers which will be in your child's science Google Classroom

To support your child with their revision, you could:

- Re-test them using the multiple choice questions from videos they have completed previously
- Ask them to re-explain things they have made notes on during the video
- Time them for 1 minute per mark in exam conditions for the practise questions
- Test them using the electronic flashcards (link to these in their science Google Classroom)
- Test them using the retrieval practice questions on from the knowledge organisers (in their science Google Classroom)
