## Year 12 'Crime scene to court room' workshop - Thursday 26 June 2025

I have arranged a one-day forensic science and courtroom workshop to bring to life the students' study of applied criminology, sociology and/or law in Year 12. Students will have the opportunity to examine a crime scene, investigate a murder based on a real case and present evidence in a mock courtroom trial. The workshop is led by a former police detective and will open the students' eyes to the wide range of future careers available in policing, forensics and the criminal justice system. It will also be excellent preparation for any students considering applying to study sociology, psychology, law or criminology at University.
