What apps/websites do we use?


















Sackville is a Google School and so many of the applications that we use are either Google based or can be accessed through the student's Google log in.



Google Chrome


As we are a Google school, accessing many of these websites is easier when using Google Chrome

Google Classroom








Guardian emails

You should have received an email from Google asking you to set up email summaries.

You will need a Google Account for this to work properly but can use your current email (even a non google one!) to set this up.

Change the frequency of emails by going to the bottom of a summary email, pressing settings, log-in to your Google account and change the frequency.



Note - If there is no work to report you will NOT receive an email even if you are signed up to daily reports.




Gmail

Guidance

- 1. If you get an email from an **unknown source**, do not open it and do not click on any **attachments**
- 2. Make sure that your **anti-virus** software is up to date
- 3. Never follow the messages from anti-virus software you encounter whilst on the internet. Only follow the anti-virus instructions from the software you have installed on your computer
- 4. Install an **anti-spyware** package
- 5. Always use a **firewall**
- 6. Ensure that your software is **up to date**
- When using a public WiFi then always use go through a VPN

For example, Windows software is routinely updated on the second Tuesday of each month (security updates are issued on that date). Should a critical update be necessary between monthly updates, make sure it is installed immediately.
